An Evening of Chamber Music At The Norwegian Seamen's Mission

If I had to describe the evening of October 1st for me this year - I would say that it is a musically informative one. That evening; I saw members and friends of Singapore AGO put up their 'Abendmusik' Chamber Concert Series; featuring music of the Bach brothers (Wilhelm Friedemann & Carl Philipp Emanuel).

Of course - this is not the first of its kind for the Guild, but definitely a first for me attend. As a new member of the Singapore AGO, I was thrilled!

Growing up with classical music training, I've never thought much of music by both Bach brothers. *Abendmusik* in this season, specifically saw the works of these two gentlemen - which Dr Evelyn Lim took time to explain on top of the programme notes that was distributed at the concert.

As Singapore celebrates its fiftieth birthday next year - the Singapore AGO too, celebrates by commissioning works by two young, local composers. One of the composers Phoon Yu, 24, also a member of the Singapore Chapter, is currently pursuing music studies at the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music.

Phoon Yu has been playing the organ for four years now. When asked, how was he drawn to organ, he says "I've always wanted to play an instrument which was not often played by other people".
