

About Us

The Singapore Chapter is the American Guild of Organists' (AGO) first chapter in Southeast Asia. It was approved by AGO headquarters on 20 October 2003 and registered with the Registry of Societies, Singapore (Unique Entity Number: T03SS0184E) on 23 December 2003. The inauguration was held in Singapore at the Kampong Kapor Methodist Church on 20 February 2004.

Since its inception, AGO Singapore Chapter has brought together all who are passionate about the organ and its music, providing many invaluable opportunities and spaces for the like-minded to share their enthusiasm for the pipe organ. As a music organisation, the Singapore AGO is unique because it pools people from diverse backgrounds - people who carry invaluable wealth of experience and talents.

The extraordinary synergy of the Chapter stems from the fact that its people come from all walks of life, and they are bonded through a common love for and appreciation of the "King of Instruments". There is no better way to describe such a massive and magnificent instrument whose very sounds evoke the vast spectrum of feelings, from the quiet contemplations of beautiful and delicate whispers, to the incredibly rich and full sounds that makes its ground shake.

OUR MISSION

The Singapore Chapter is the Guild's first chapter in Southeast Asia. It was approved by the AGO headquarters on 20 October 2003 and inaugurated on 20 February 2004. The Singapore Chapter is registered with the Registry of Societies, Singapore (ROS 0296/2003). The Singapore Chapter strives to uphold the mission, vision and value proposition of the American Guild of Organists, which is: to foster a thriving community of musicians who share their knowledge and inspire passion for the organ. The vision of the American Guild of Organists is to engage, support, and uplift every organist. A non-profit organization, the Singapore Chapter is run by volunteers who are professional organists, church organists, music teachers and supporters of organ music. Regular concerts by visiting artists and clinicians, masterclasses, music festivals and collaborations with arts groups and churches make up the main activities of the Chapter. It all began 22 years ago as an informal membership to an online "Yahoo" group, called "Singapore Organists' Network". At the time, there was no common platform where organists and organ music enthusiasts could meet, exchange ideas, and make music together. This group comprising local organists and music teachers soon decided to take a step forward and make things official. It took many months, but finally submissions to the local authorities and the AGO headquarters were approved by December 2003. Excitedly, we made plans for the inauguration of the Chapter, and were really grateful to be hosted by Kampong Kapor Methodist Church, which has the only pipe organ in a local Methodist church.

20th February 2004 saw a historic event— we were inaugurated as South East Asia's very first AGO Chapter! A number of supportive clergy members, notable figures from the musical community and our own circle of friends joined in the musical celebration. The real work began soon after, as we launched a series of concerts, educational events and the big test — the Pipe Organ Encounters (POE), which was modelled loosely after the American versions.

It has been 20 years with many concerts, masterclasses, and musical evenings — what have we got to show for all this? A Community. With the hard work and musical passion of Chapter members and our wonderful friends, we as a community strive to further the cause of organ music and its varied experience in music education, religious worship and in the performing arts.

Dr Evelyn Lim, DMA Dean (2024-2026) Singapore AGO When I was asked to take up the Programme Director role, I did not really know what it entailed. One evening - while hosting a dinner with organist Chelsea Chen, she exclaimed "Oh you're the one who makes the Dean's ideas into reality (paraphrased)!". The rest as they say, is history.

On top hosting recitals and workshops by visiting organists, we reinstated our regular members' concert and incorporated more varied programs (i.e. with voices, strings and wind instruments), thereby providing more avenues for members to engage in.

The following years saw growth in membership and improvements in musicianship. With the reopening of Victoria Concert Hall after five years of refurbishment and more instruments available in Singapore, alongside more public interest in organs, we started having more internal engagements projects and also with organisations. We also created the online Pipe Organ database project and executed the Organ Academy Singapore (OAS), just to name a few. COVID-19 did not deter us from reinventing ourselves. We took on the opportunities to learn and launch our OrganBytes video project (10 Episodes by far!) — bringing our local instruments and performers closer to the public.

We've come a long way – dotted with challenges and little victories. But witnessing the fruits of labour together with equally dedicated members makes it all worthwhile.

Let us raise our glasses to many more purposeful and fruitful years ahead!



Yap Wai Hoong Programme Director (2024-2026) Singapore AGO

We started the Singapore Organists' Network - a mailing list on Yahoo Groups (now defunct) as a means to share news of organ recitals, workshops, etc. It had around 40 members at its height and helped to increase awareness of the organ landscape in Singapore and attempted to bring organ aficionados together.

The idea of forming a Singapore Chapter of the AGO originated from Dr Evelyn Lim, together with Dr Margaret Chen's support, and through the late Mrs Esther Seet's indefatigable efforts, successfully pushed through the creation of this Chapter. Esther, with her extensive experience, helped us tremendously with the processes of kickstarting this endeavour.

Over several sessions of afternoon tea at the Tanglin Club, the nascent core of Singapore AGO discussed and collaborated. Eventually leading to the signing of a petition for the organization of a chapter to AGO National Headquarters on 20 July 2003. Followed by the formal adoption of our constitution, operating procedures and by-laws on 18 January 2004 and the inauguration at Kampong Kapor Methodist Church on 20 February 2004.

Since then Singapore AGO has organized many events with the highlights being the Pipe Organ Encounters (2005) and Organ Academy of Singapore (2019). Many well-known organists, to name a few - Felix Hell, Sophie-Véronique Cauchefer-Choplin, Paul Jacobs, Dong-ill Shin and others have visited and given recitals. It is my fervent hope that the Chapter can continue to bring attention to the organ and cultivate new audiences to appreciate the intricacies and grandeur of this instrument.




PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTERS


On 14th March 2017, Pipe Works Series returned, with Dr Michael Burkhardt on the J.W. Walker organ.

Walker and Taylor & Sons organ, these presentations included both traditional and contemporary hymns, complemented by various readings. These events marked a significant return to community gatherings and musical celebrations following the disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.




